

## Barron County least expensive UW campus

### **In these challenging economic times, UW-Barron County continues to maintain its long-held reputation as the UW System's most affordable entry point for incoming college students.**

UW Colleges and UW-Extension Chancellor David Wilson reminds prospective students of all ages that, with the UW Colleges tuition rates frozen at 2006 levels, attending UW-Barron County can save them thousands of dollars annually. UW-Barron County is part of the UW Colleges, the 13 freshman/sophomore campuses of the UW System.

Tuition and fees at UW-Barron County is \$4,692 for 2008-09. This is \$2,872 less than the tuition/fees at UW-Madison, \$2,613 less than UW-Milwaukee and \$1,435 less than the other four-year UW campuses. UW-Barron County also utilizes a textbook rental system that saves the student approximately \$1,000 per year on book purchases and, by living at home, they also save thousands in room and board costs.

Wilson plans to forward a request to the Board of Regents to keep tuition for the 2009-10 academic year frozen at the 2006 and current rate.
