

# **Administrative Integration Increasing Baccalaureate Degrees Work Group**

June 15, 2005

## **Charge**

The group will develop new and innovative systems to provide access for place-bound, non-traditional, and under served students to baccalaureate degrees.

To complete its work, the group is expected to:

1. Identify existing capacity at UW- Colleges and UW-Extension including programs, staff, faculty, delivery and support services.
2. Identify both geographic location and degree interests of Wisconsin population groups currently not served by existing UWS institutions.
3. Develop new delivery models that take advantage of innovative uses of technology including, but not limited to, on-line learning, digital television, flexible scheduling of time and place and other non-traditional formats.
4. Build on existing high touch and high tech strengths of UW-Colleges and UW-Extension to develop models for advising and supporting the educational needs of the identified students.
5. Examine existing alliances which help meet the needs of under served degree seekers. These include other UWS institutions, WTCS, and K-12 schools. Identify areas where new alliances are needed and develop strategies to create them.

## **Outcomes**

By September, 2005, the IBWG will present a completed plan of action to the Steering Committee.
